Ann Clements	Ann worked with an organization called Friends of Refugees in Clarkston. She recorded a variety of children's books on cassette tapes for the children's homework center there to teach refugee children how to read. She also labeled the tapes and the books, and donated several cassette tape players to the center. Along with her troop, she held a sock hop to raise funds in order to buy the materials needed. She was able to collect and record 40 books which she donated to the shelter.

Hasanthi Piyasena & Amy Rothschild	They collected backpacks and school supplies for underprivileged children at the North Fulton Community Charities. They helped organize a school supply drive, made flyers, decorated and placed collection boxes at several local schools and gathered and organized supplies into backpacks.
